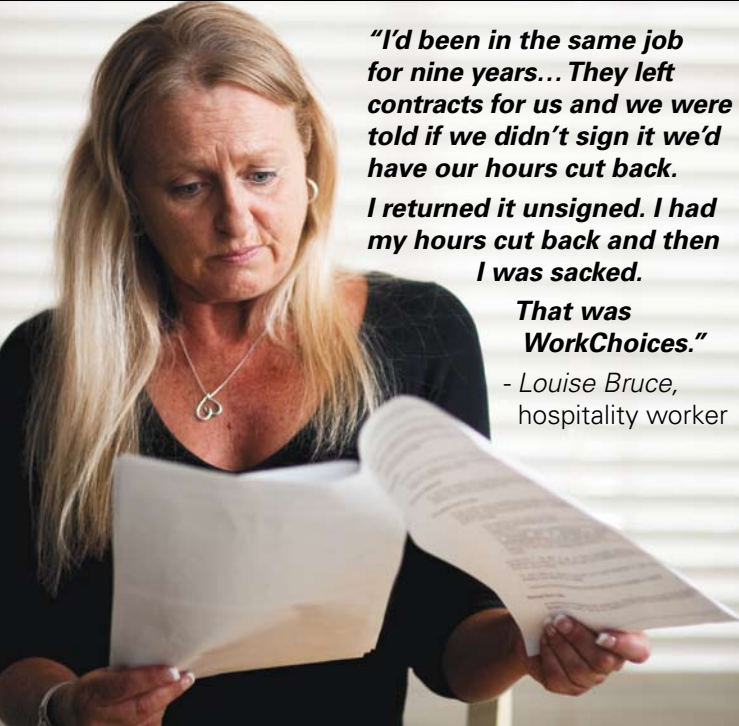

Tony Abbott will bring back WorkChoices

WorkChoices took away the rights of working Australians.

It put downward pressure on the wages and conditions of all workers, especially the more than one million who suffered real pay cuts under the Liberals' so-called 'Fair Pay Commission'.

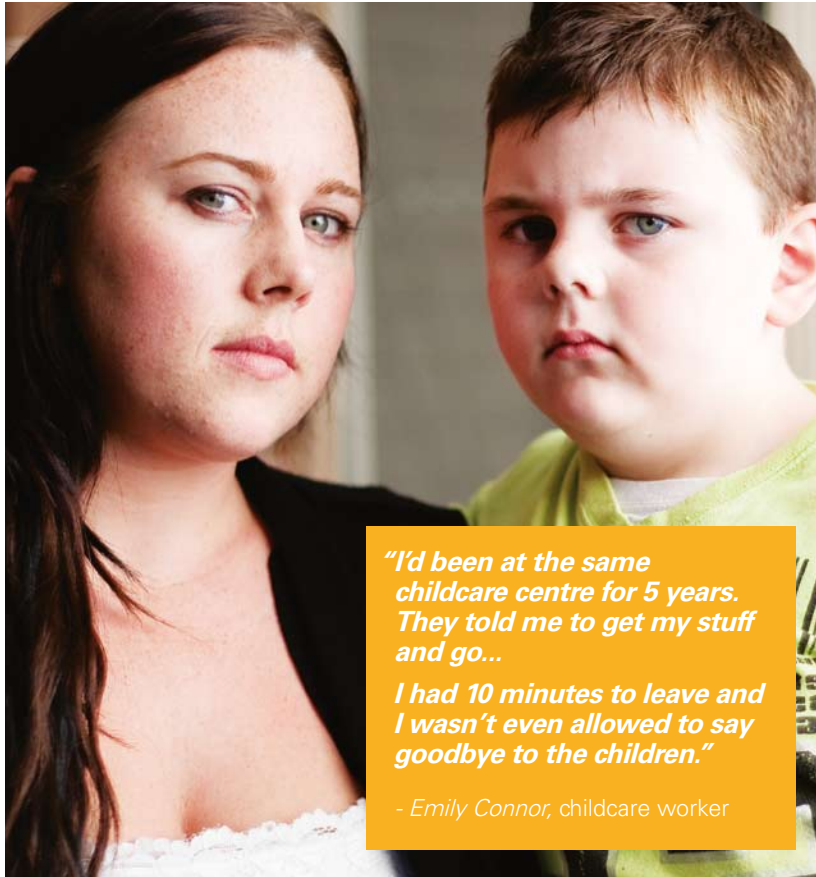
Hundreds of thousands of workers lost not just pay but also conditions such as shift loadings, annual leave loadings and penalty rates.

Protection from unfair dismissal was stripped away and untold numbers were sacked.

Young workers, women and casuals were the most vulnerable to WorkChoices and ended up being the hardest hit victims. Australians voted to get rid of WorkChoices at the last election.

He chooses not to say WorkChoices is dead – just the name.

What he's really saying is he'll let employers dismiss workers unfairly.

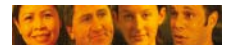
And he'll introduce individual contracts that cut pay, conditions and rights.
