Your rights at risk... again.

Under WorkChoices more than three million Australians lost protection from being sacked unfairly. And more than a million Australians had their pay and conditions cut under AWA individual contracts and changes to minimum wages.

Labor's new Fair Work laws have restored many rights lost under WorkChoices. Workers are protected from unfair dismissal and new AWA individual contracts are banned. There is a safety net of National Employment Standards, awards

and minimum wages with a stronger independent workplace umpire. Workers have collective bargaining rights and the right to join a union and be represented.

These changes are a good first step but more needs to be done – especially for workers in the construction industry and those covered by awards.

We need to go forward on workers' rights, not backwards to the Liberals' new version of WorkChoices.
